It is with heavy hearts and great sadness that we announce the passing of Eduardo Encarnacion Islao at aged 68. He passed away on August 24, 2024, in Wahiawa, Hawaii.

Born on October 5, 1955 to Trinidad Yatar Islao (deceased) and Felomina Encarnacion Islao (deceased). He came to Hawaii in August 1987 for the hope of a better life for his family. He provided for his family who were all living in the Philippines until August 1994 when his loving wife joined him, followed by his 3 children in April 1996. He dedicated much of his life to the Dole Plantation Company, contributing significantly to his community.
