### Paul Ng, Sr. Obituary

With heavy hearts, we share the story of Paul Wah Teong Ng Sr.'s life and his peaceful passing on June 7, 2024 at 97 years old.

Growing up in Kaimuki with five brothers, he graduated from St. Louis High School, enrolled in College Prep classes and held various jobs, including a cashier at NK supply store, car salesman at Pflueger and manager at Golden Duck.
