Cynthia Kisako Hashimoto of Mililani Mauka passed away on January 15, 2024. She was born in Wahiawa on June 4, 1947, to Kenneth and Rachael Harada (deceased) of Dot's in Wahiawa.

Cynthia attended Leilehua High School and graduated from Mid-Pacific Institute in 1965. Her pursuit of education led her to the University of Hawaii, where she earned a Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology in 1970. During her time at the university, she crossed paths with her future husband, Ted W. Hashimoto, from Hilo, while serving as an Army ROTC Sponsor.
