Of course, living off island, the tangible time spent with my papa was often in increments - in between birthdays, college and high school graduations, award ceremonies, and most recently, promotions in my work - all of which I was happy to share with him over and over again just to hear the excitement in his voice when he heard that I was out there making something of myself. In every conversation, and after every shared milestone, papa would tell me "œyou're on your way Amylia". And I just want him to know that I still am. I'm just sore at the fact that now, my mind is the only place where I can hear you say it. And I'm going to miss that for the rest of my life. I love you, Papa. It's been a long 10 years without grandma. But I understand that it's time for you to begin your new journey and I'll be sure to tell her, "œyou're on your way".
