Brent Takeshi Furomoto, 33, passed away unexpectedly on September 14, 2022. He was the third and youngest son of Karen and Randal Furomoto of Mililani, Hawaii. Brent was an excellent musician and enjoyed being a part of MHS band and Hawaii Youth Symphony in his high school years. After graduating from Mililani High School in 2006 he completed degrees at Indiana University at Bloomington and IUPUI in Indianapolis, and attained a Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine at Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences in 2016.
