He also graduated from beauty school, and loved to create new hairstyles for his family on special occasions. He worked for a time at La Roy’s Hairstyling

Keoki loved his family, and was especially close to his sister Jane. When she unexpectedly passed away in March, and he was diagnosed with cancer shortly after, he requested having a dual service if he didn’t make it till her first anniversary. Honoring his wishes, services for Keoki and his sister, Jane Dittman, will be held on Friday, March 20, 2020 at Immaculate Conception Church in Ewa Villages.
