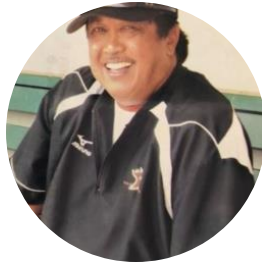

### **R**ex Baccay Obituary
