Visitation begins at 5:30 pm and service 6:30 pm.

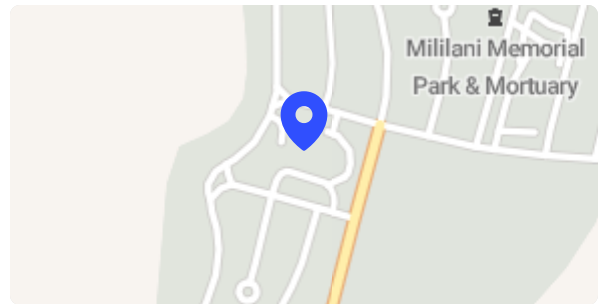

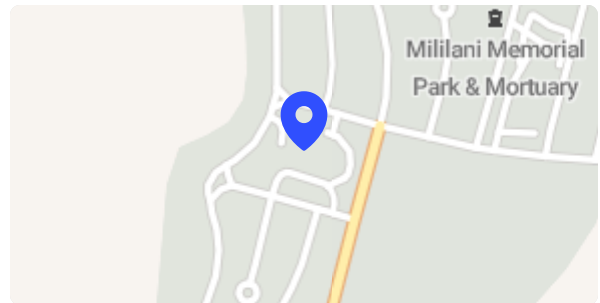
