Throughout his battle against cancer, he continued to have a positive attitude and often told everyone, "I'm not giving up." He did everything his doctor recommended over the 3 years, but the cancer was too aggressive and eventually spread throughout his body. There were complications during his treatments, despite doing everything he could and entering a clinical trial, the cancer responded with full force. In August 2025, he was told the cancer was not responding to any treatments but, in fact, growing rapidly. Throughout his life, Chad was known for his deep love for family, his tireless work ethic, and his big heart. He leaves behind a legacy. He is known to be selfless, humble, independent, hardworking, and, above all, loving. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and son.

### Early life:

Chad lived his entire life in Wahiawa, Hawaii. He had a passion for cars and spent his early years competing in Autocross. He often bragged about his days when he used to autocross and how he placed in numerous competitions. He grew up working on cars with his dad and brother Jon. He spent 25 years working as a refuse truck operator and thoroughly enjoyed his job. His passion was simply driving. He lived his life "a quarter mile at a time" and believed we should live life to the fullest with no regrets. He did exactly that.

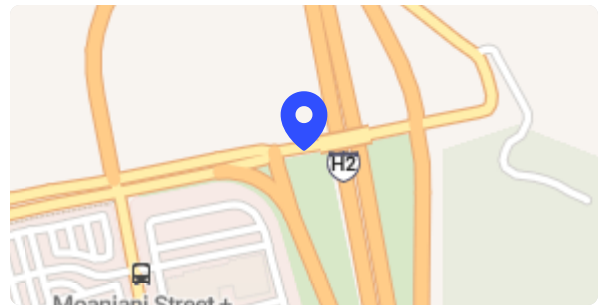
